# Camp Barnard – Camp Rules

Please distribute to all Leaders and Adults attending camp

## Use of Camp Barnard

All groups wishing to use Camp Barnard must fully complete the registration form and provide a deposit by way of a cheque made out to "Scouts Canada-Camp Barnard". Outside groups must also complete the "Hold Harmless and Indemnity Agreement" and provide proof of insurance.

All shared areas should be booked with Camp Ranger upon arrival at Camp. This applies to the waterfront, amphitheatre, playing field and chapel.

Main gate will be closed from 11:00 pm to 7:00 am. A public phone is located at the turn-around by the camp office.

**Check-in:** Check-in and check-out time is 3:00 pm. Contact person must check in with Camp Ranger upon arrival at camp and check out on departure.

**Drugs and alcohol:** Alcoholic beverages or non-prescription drugs are not allowed in camp or while travelling to or returning from camp. Smoking is permitted outdoors and away from youth.

**Pets:** No pets of any kind are allowed on site. (ie. no cats, dogs etc.)

**Fire Danger:** Camp lanterns, stoves and heaters are not allowed in any cabin or tent. Fires may be lit only in designated fire-pits. During hot dry weather, fire restrictions may be applied by the Camp Ranger.

**Parking:** Parking is allowed in the designated parking lot only. Temporary parking (up to 15 min) is allowed on main road beyond the parking lot for drop-off and pick-up only. Trailers and other recreational vehicles cannot be parked in camping areas and are limited to the main parking lot, the open area at the beginning of the trail to Mount Bluff and across from the Ranger's house in Lower 40 and in other areas designated by the Camp Ranger. The road beyond the gate to the Back Country is restricted to service vehicles only or others as approved by the Camp Ranger.

**Young Lake:** All water sport regulations laid down in B, P & P are to be observed. These regulations will be posted in the Camp Office and in the boathouse. Adult on-water supervision is required for all water activities.

**Emergencies:** The camp office must be notified within 20 minutes if someone is missing or injured. If no one is available at the Camp Office, the RCMP in Sooke should be notified as soon as possible (dial 911).

## **General Camp Guidelines:**

- Leaders are responsible for the health, safety and conduct of their Group including all visitors.
- Groups are responsible to provide their own first-aider.
- Trees must not be cut down on or off the camp property except as designated by the Camp Ranger.
- Firearms and fireworks are not allowed in camp. Bow & arrows and slingshots, as per B P & P regulations. Areas to be used designated by Camp Ranger.
- Drinking water must be obtained only from designated sources. Lake and stream water is unsafe.
- No nails, tacks or staples are to be used on any building (inside or out) or any tree or post.
- The Chapel is for the use of all faiths and is not a play area.
- Raiding of tents, lodges and camp sites is forbidden.
- Power tools like chainsaws are not to be used by camping groups.
- Charges will be made to cover damages to camp equipment, buildings or property.
- All garbage is to be removed and placed in garbage bags, tied at the top and placed in bin located in parking area.
- All groups are required to take their recycling back with them.
- Groups are responsible for clean-up of lodge, campsite, kitchen and washroom.
- All items brought to camp must be removed.
- Any group in violation of these guidelines may be assessed costs.
- Contact persons must ensure that everything is completed and checked by the Ranger and all members of their group are off the premises before they leave. Check-out time is 3:00 pm.
- All groups are urged to do a camp-good-turn while at camp, a list of these is available from the Camp Ranger.
